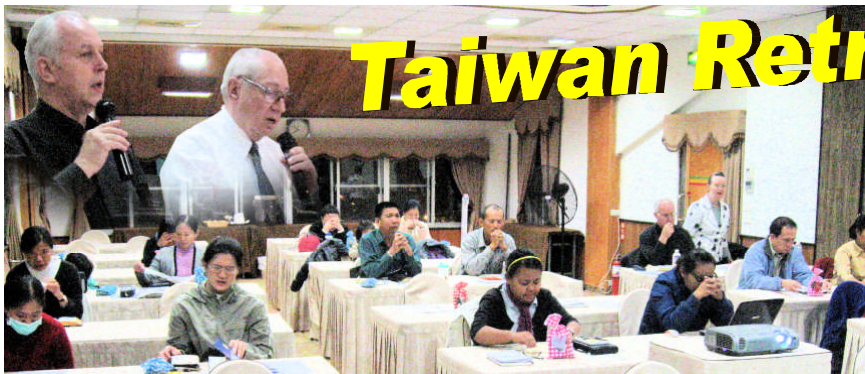
# Hmong Revival
