What Profit is there from a Bible School? ... Much Every Way!

Fast Facts:

- By 2004 year end, 23 of the 45 General Licensed ministers in Thailand will be Bible School graduates.
- Two churches, each without pastors for over 2 years, and another one without a pastor for over 10 years, now have Bible School graduate ministers leading them.
- Students from the Bible School have been providing the ministry for a nearby church without a pastor for the past three years. Soon a graduate minister will take the oversight.
- Currently a new church is being planted in a Hmong village and two graduates will begin to minister in that location. Funds for the purchase of land and a small building are being provided through donations to the Bible School.
- Donations via the Bible School purchased land next to one of our existing Hmong churches to provide space to build living quarters for graduates ministering in that church.
- The Bible School Superintendent and two of the teachers are Bible School graduates, each a General Licensed minister.
- Six graduates are receiving partial support through the Bible School to help them establish their works.
- The Bible School has held revivals in two distant locations in Thailand at Bible School expense.
- The Bible School is reprinting four Apostolic books originally produced in Thai through Rev. William (Billy) H. Cole's ministry 37 years ago. Additionally, the Bible School has translated 11 Apostolic books from English into Thai and is having them printed for distribution to the Thai Ministers at no cost to them. Translation will be an ongoing work.
- 18 of our 20 graduates to date are actively ministering in various churches throughout Thailand, as well as many other former students that did not have opportunity to graduate.
